# **Annual Series Awards**

Dressage
Winner and reserve for Levels 0, 1, 2, 3, 4. Points accumulated over WRC Dressa
shows excluding HAG (Have-A-Go)
Each combination may only win once per level with the exception of level 4 In the case of a draw the winner will be the person with the highest percentage
Show Hunter
Winner and reserve for overall points from WRC Show Hunter shows
In the case of a draw the winner will be the person with the highest percentage
TTR
Novice and Open trophy if a series is run
Mini ODE

### **High Points**

- Based on the <u>COMBINATION</u> of horse and rider (Include Young/Old Horse High Points).
- You can only be eligible for one cup. This includes BOTH Section Awards and Special High Points.
- If you win two of the High Points then we will contact you to determine which award you would like to receive and the other award will go to the person with the next highest amount of points.
- Any combination may enter clinics and 'Have-A-Go' days. These do not count towards point tables
- In the case of a draw, the winner will be determined by using the highest percentage for Dressage (Flat/Flat and Jumping) and the greatest Show hunter score (jumping). If the jumping winner has not competed in a Show hunter event, The total points from the first jumping event of the season will be calculated.
- To be eligible you must not have won the same cup in the previous year as a combination.

## **High Points - Section Awards**

#### Flat High Points: Winner and Runner-Up

Awarded to the combination with the most points over flat classes only.

- Including but not limited to; Dressage, Flat section of ribbon day, TTR
- Must NOT have competed in <u>ANY</u> jump section at WRC events

### **Jumping High Points: Winner and Runner-Up**

Awarded to the combination with the most points in jumping events only


- Including but not limited to: Show Jumping, Show Hunter, Derbys, Show Cross, Jump section of Ribbon Day, and ODE/Mini ODE
- Must NOT have competed in **ANY** flat section at WRC events

#### **Flat and Jumping High Points**

Awarded to the combination with the most points in both flat and jumping events combined

 Must have competed in <u>at least</u> one jumping competition and one flat competition throughout the season

### **High Points - Special High Points**



#### **Newcomer Rider Cup**

Awarded to a NEW member to WRC who gains the most points over the season in our lower level events

- Must be competing at level 1 or lower in dressage and jumping under 70cms at the start
  of the season
- A new member is someone in their first season of competition with WRC
- People who have competed at any dressage event level 2 or above AND/OR have jumped 70cm or above before the start of the season (outside of WRC) are not eligible.

#### **Young Horse Cup**

Awarded to the RIDER of the young horse that has gained the most points during the season.

- Horse must be 6 years or under as at the 1st of August at the start of the season. (Your horse could be 6 year 11 months, but this will still count)
- Age is taken as the actual birth date if known. If the DOB is unknown, it is considered
  the horses birthday on the 1st of August. Even if the horse is only 2 months old at the
  first of August it would be considered 1.

### **Maddie Memorial Cup (Old Horse Cup)**

Awarded to the RIDER of the old horse that has gained the most points during the season

Horse must be 21 years or over. Age declared as per young horse cup rulings above

The Maddie memorial cup was kindly donated in 2018 by long serving member Jackie Benfell in memory of her 'old horse'. The same evening our members suggested an 'old horse cup' in a survey, Jackie made the tough decision to send her much loved 36YO Maddie over the rainbow bridge. Thank you, Jackie, for your support to the club

#### **Nominated Awards**

WRC Committee send out an email approaching the end of the season encouraging members to nominate fellow members for the following awards

#### **Bannerman Memorial**

• This award is for the horse that is a great all-rounder, who has turned his/her hoof to anything the rider desired to do, he/she may not necessarily be the winner but has had a good go at participating anyway!

Dedicated in memory of Banner, Olwyn Wheeler's special blue roan horse, an incredible allround loveable horse who was part of the Wheeler family for 12 years. Banner had several surgeries to remove cancer from around his eyes at great expense. He was worth every cent and for the next 2 ½ yrs he had quality of life and was ridden regularly up until two days before he passed away peacefully in his paddock at the age of 22.

## **Tamara Sportsmanship Award**

• This award is for the person who has demonstrated great sportsmanlike behaviour, i.e. helping others even if they are competing against them! (Just one example)

The Tamara Sportsmanship Award was named after Heather Gurney's horse Tamara, a beautiful chestnut mare. Their first few seasons together were interesting but Tamara and Heather's partnership blossomed and they had the best fun over the next 10 years. In March 2003, Tamara was tragically put down after breaking her leg following the stampede at Great NZ Horse Trek in Taranaki. This trophy is dedicated to the memory of Tamara, a very special little horse with a big heart.

### Points for events with multiple classes – Ribbon Days, Inhand, Showmanship

Each individual's total is added together and then ranked separately for each ring/level

• Points are awarded based on the rank given as follows: 20 points for the top ranker and so on down to 1 point for the 20th ranker.

Ribbon day points are done separately for each ring for both jumping and flat sections.
This means the total any one combination could earn from a ribbon day is 40 points in
total (20 + 20) if they top ranked for both their chosen flat ring and for their chosen
jumping ring.
